
Improved attendance

Schools with a maintenance backlog suffer lower attendance rates and higher annual dropout rates.



Students are more likely to attend school regularly when maintenance backlogs are minimal and the learning environment is positive.





Attendance rates

- Likely to fall behind their peers and have a higher rate of dropping out. 1
- Chronically absent and have an increase risk of dropping out.1
- Attendance rate of 90% or higher and have a higher rate of graduating. 1

Student success

Student attention, attendance, and testing declines in school facilities requiring more maintenance work and repairs. 2


